Thank you to those who have lost a loved one in the past year for sharing their memories.

David Shneer lived a full and happy life in his 48 short years. He was a brilliant scholar and mentor to his students at the University of Colorado. David was a loving father, husband, son, brother and friend. He had so many varied interests it was hard to keep up with what he was doing. He wrote many books, sang many songs, rode many miles on his bike, traveled the world many times over, just had fun and enjoyed life. He impacted so many lives in a positive way. We were blessed to be his family.

Lawrence Terfansky (never call him Larry!!!!) was a kind and gentle man. He had 3 great loves. First his daughter, Carol. Lawrence's last wish was to see her happy again after her husband died in a plane crash a few years ago. In June, Carol married Mike surrounded by photos of her Dad. Second, my sister Roslyn. They married in their late forties and had many happy years together. Third, his dog Shnigle - a match made in heaven. He was like a big brother to us and we miss him very much.

Jeffrey Frankel, Jillian's Dad, passed away on April 3rd of this year. Every day, Jillian says "I miss my Dad" and I know what she means. We were married for more than 15 years, and even though we were divorced, we never got a "get" on purpose. I wanted Jillian to know that her Dad and I are connected spiritually and in the eyes of God. He was a terrific parent for Jillian, always going above and beyond. He stuck up for her and the entire Special Needs community, even going so far as to become elected as a Board Member for the Palos Verdes School District's Board of Education. Everything he did was informed through the lens of his daughter: what would she need most, and how could he secure it for her? Anyone who knew Jeff knows that he would do his research to help others, whether it was to find the best "deal" or read the Yelp reviews to find the best doctor. He'd speak the unspeakable, for example, he would say "maybe humanity isn't meant to live forever" in regards to how we are treating the planet and developing a death economy. He was unflinching in his approach to reality, because before Jillian was born, he said he wanted a perfect report on her genetic tests or he wanted to abort. But then he rose to the occasion and love filled in all his imperfections and made him the most amazing parent. In short, he became a better person through Jillian and his love for her. He was taken too soon, as he was only 58 years old. He was a macher in society and he will be sorely missed by Jillian, me, and the community he was meant to serve.

Elaine ‘Grammy’ Grove was born in Chicago on September 30, 1927. Her parents owned a ‘butter and egg store’ on the South Side of Chicago where she grew up with her older brother Sid Z’l. She met the love of her life, Robert, in a Young Zionists Youth group when she was 13 and he was 14. They had plans to live in Israel on a Kibbutz after graduating high school. But that was not meant to be as Robert was drafted into the Navy during WW2. They married shortly before he was posted in the shipyards in Bremerton, Wa., a world away from the Jewish neighborhood in Chicago. After the war, they began a family back home in Chicago. There they had 3 children, Alan, Gary and Gale. After completing a Master’s in Electrical Engineering, they moved to Baltimore, where Robin was born. It was always their dream to move to California, which they did in the fall of 1962, settling in Rancho Palos Verdes. Elaine earned a Master’s degree in 1968 and began teaching in South Central Los Angeles where she taught ‘her’ inner city kids for 20 years. She was a guide and mentor and was their advocate as many of them went on to college. She has 8 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren. She was caring and strong and known as a ‘social butterfly’ and friend to all. Her favorite question was, ‘are you happy, happy, happy?’ as being only one happy wasn’t enough. She is and will be missed by all who knew and loved her.
